### **EVANGELISM**

Evangelism is the act of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with others: the message that, through his life, death, and resurrection, all people can receive forgiveness, new life, and eternal hope. It is not simply a religious duty, but a loving response to what God has done for us. Evangelism grows out of gratitude and compassion; when we truly experience God's grace, we naturally desire others to experience the same joy and freedom.

For us today, Evangelism means living and speaking in a way that points people to Christ. It is more than preaching: it is showing God's love through our everyday actions, relationships, and conversations. In a world searching for meaning, peace, and belonging, our witness can be a light that draws others to hope.

Evangelism is important because eternity is real, and God's desire is for all to come to know him. Jesus commanded his followers, "Go and make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19). When we share our faith, we join God's mission to redeem the world. Evangelism reminds us that our faith should not be private, but should shine forth, transforming lives, communities, and generations with the power of the gospel.

### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is designed to train believers in the art of relational evangelism. You will learn to communicate your faith in an authentic, personal, and consistent way, being yourself while remaining effective.

We will explore how to build meaningful relationships with non-believers, how to maintain conversations that deepen faith, how to tell your story of transformation, how to explain the gospel message clearly, and how to help others take the step toward faith in Christ. The topics will include:

- 1. The Great Omission
- 2. Know the Message
- 3. Relational Evangelism
- 4. Styles of Evangelism

### **RELEVANCE TO LIFE**

This course not only seeks to teach evangelism techniques, but also to transform the way each believer lives and shares their faith on a daily basis. Through the teachings, participants will learn to integrate their Christian witness naturally into their personal life, work, and family relationships.

The course will help strengthen security in their faith, develop a more coherent and authentic spiritual life, and discover the joy of positively influencing others for Christ. It will also foster personal growth in areas such as empathy, effective communication, sensitivity to the spiritual needs of others, and the courage to live with purpose and conviction.

### **LEARNING OUTCOMES**

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to: (1) Understand the Christian call to share the gospel and the benefits of living as a contagious Christian. (2) Identify their personal evangelism style and how it can integrate with their character and context. (3) Develop deep and authentic relationships with people who do not yet know Christ, applying principles of closeness (proximity) and spiritual power. (4) Tell their own faith story in a simple, honest, and meaningful way. (5) Explain the biblical truth of the gospel in clear and applicable language. (6) Facilitate a conversation that invites others to cross the line of faith, and have the confidence to pray with them in that moment.

### **WEEK 4: STYLES OF EVANGELISM**

Identify their natural evangelism style, understanding that God uses different ways to draw people to Him. Learn to recognize their "personal seal" when sharing Christ, and discover how to be effective and authentic in their witnessing, with freedom, sensitivity, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
